Reading – a home/ school collaboration

We expect that every child engages in at least one enjoyable reading activity at home with a grown-up every day, which is where they will be able to put into practise what they have learned and develop a love of books and reading. Please help your child to reach their potential by supporting them with reading at home. Each child will have a brand new yellow reading diary each year, so please record a quick note each day of any reading at home. Start the new year with good habits and establish a routine that makes quality time for books - always. Thank you for your support and commitment. We are so passionate about reading at Shalford and hope you are too!

Balances

IMPORTANT MESSAGE: If you would like your child to have a school lunch, your account must be in credit. You must therefore top up in advance, using MCAS. If your account is below £0, we will call you and ask you to top up or bring in a packed lunch. Reception, Y1 and Y2 are provided with a free school meal, so can ignore the above. If your child is in Y3-6 and you feel that you may be eligible for free meals due to a low income or other factor, please contact Mrs Coombs in the office and she can check this quickly and confidentially for you.

Online safety -a reminder

It has been in the news over the summer that, sadly, online grooming is at an all time high. The NSPCC website provides some sound advice about keeping children safe online. Please do take time to read this: Keeping children safe online | NSPCC

As staff and parents, it is our joint responsibility to ensure we:

- have safe filtering
- have age-appropriate screentime limits
- control which websites, apps and games children have access to (making sure children are the correct age to use them)
- don't allow children to talk to others online and teach them not to make online 'friends' that may not be who they say they are
- don't allow primary school aged children to use any Social Media sites such as Instagram and Tiktok etc.
- supervise all use of the internet (especially Youtube!) and regularly check search history
- talk your child through any worries you have, when you notice they have shown signs of unsafe online behaviour
- discourage any overly violent games or games that have the sole aim of 'killing' – this is really unhealthy and affects how children play and socially interact at school. Some free gaming sites don't have age -restrictions so you have to make the decision yourself.

Water Bottles Reminder

All children need a water bottle in school each day and will be encouraged to drink fluids throughout the day.

Communication at drop off time

Parents are not allowed on site in the mornings. If you need to communicate with the class teacher, please do so via an alternative method or pass a message through Mrs Coombs in the office. New Reception children only,



can be accompanied by their parent, to the low gate or door of Elm Class. All other pupils must say goodbye at the main entrance gate. Teacher email addresses are the bottom of this newsletter if you need them.

Times Tables

Please encourage your child to know their times tables off by heart. It is an essential life skill. In particular Y2, Y3 and Y4 pupils should be working towards knowing them 'off by heart' before the summer term of Y4. Children can use this fun website to practise - It's free.

School Day and Attendance Reminders

Let us start the new school year with good attendance habits too. Please ensure your child is on time for school each day. Drop off time is between 8.35am and 8.45am. If children miss the register at 8.45am, they will be marked as unauthorised/late. Pick up time is 3.15pm outside your child's classroom.

I cannot authorise any term-time holidays or days out, so do expect a fine if you take your child out. All schools across Essex follow the same expectations. We strongly encourage you to ensure that your children have high attendance levels, otherwise they are at risk of falling behind their peers academically and missing out on social opportunities.

If your child needs time off school for essential appointments or other reasons, you will need to fill in an absence request form and provide evidence (e.g. screenshot or copy of appointment letter). Mrs Coombs can provide you with a form.

We request that you book dentist appointments and anything non urgent, outside of school hours.

Y6 parents – Secondary Schools

The closing date to apply for Secondary school places for September 2024 has not yet been announced but is usually around the end of October. I am sure you will have already begun to consider the options and found out about open days for your Year 6 child. Once you have decided, you can apply online here: <u>Secondary</u> <u>school places | Essex County Council</u>. The nearest schools are Tabor and Hedingham but we find that children from Shalford go to a range of other schools too.

Morning Snack Reminder

All children are only allowed to eat FRUIT/VEG/DRIED FRUIT at breaktimes. No cereal bars or other snacks are allowed. Elm and Ash Class (Year R, 1, 2) are provided with a free piece of fruit/veg each day.

Please name all individual items of PE Kit and uniform.

Jewellery: very small, plain stud earrings are permitted but larger studs and hoops/dangly earrings are not permitted. All jewellery to be removed for PE. If children are too young or unable to take out own earrings, they should not wear them on PE/swim days.

Hair: hair must be tied back for the whole school day. We will ask children to tie their hair back when they come in with it loose.

No trainers or sandals for school please - plain black shoes only.

No nail varnish please.

Swimming Information

All children in Beech Class go swimming in the Spring Term (January to Easter Holidays), meaning they have approximately 12 lessons, for 2 year in a row, totalling around 24 lessons. More information will come to you nearer the time. Differing abilities will be catered for, but it is obviously much better if your child can swim a little before these lessons start, so please go ahead and book swimming lessons if it is something you are considering doing outside of school. It is so good for wellbeing and general fitness, as well as being an essential life skill.

Breakfast Club and After School Clubs

To attend Early Bird/Breakfast Club, just turn up at the black door in the carpark and ring the doorbell. There is a sibling discount which will show up on your MCAS account.

Option 1: Breakfast Club starts at 8am and includes Toast/cereal/drinks for £3.50 per day. Option 2: 'Early Bird' Club starts at 8.15am and does not include food or drink - we expect that children have eaten before they arrive. The cost for Early Bird Club is only £1.25 per day. If a child needs to arrive before 8.15am, the price will be £3.50, regardless of whether they eat or not.

All our after-school clubs run 3.15-4.15pm and must be booked in advance. All Clubs are available to all ages. See details for each club below:
