### \*Times Tables\*

You need times tables for lots of other maths, such as long multiplication, division, word problems, etc. not to mention in real life situations. It really is an essential skill, so please help your child to practise at home from Y2 onwards, so that they have a good chance of success. have a login and Miss Neave is giving her class daily practice time but anyone can have a go.

### **Teacher Strikes**

You may have seen in the news that there will be more planned industrial action across a number of industries, teaching included. Nationally, the NEU have called two further strike days on 27<sup>th</sup> April (now passed) and 2<sup>nd</sup> May. I do not predict school closure for our school on these two dates, but please bear in mind that teachers who are part of the NEU or those who are not members of a union are allowed to strike at the last minute or take part in a strike even if they did not take part in previous strike days. I will inform you at the earliest possible moment if a class is going to close.

# School Day/Attendance Reminder

Thank you to those parents who are getting their children to school on time every day and to those who are making an effort to improve punctuality - we have noticed and appreciate you working hard on this so that children can benefit from a full school day and do not miss out on any essential part of it.

Drop off time is between 8.35am and 8.45am. If children miss the register at 8.45am, they will be marked as unauthorised/late. Pick up time is 3.15pm outside your child's classroom. The new attendance officer now comes to school regularly and grills me about the attendance of anyone who has dropped below 95%, so be prepared for a phone call or a meeting with her, if this applies to your child. Do speak to one of us if you having an issue getting your child to school on time

Very rarely can I authorise any term time holidays or days out during term time, so do expect a fine if you take your child out. We also do not advise lying about illness, as if the child comes in with a lovely glow and says they have been to Tenerife, it will still be put down as unauthorised and may result in a fine (plus it is very awkward and unfair on the child). These are not my rules, but the rules of Essex County Council and the Government, which we must abide by. All schools across Essex will be following the same expectations. For your information, fines do not come to us, but to the Local Authority. Only two fines per year will be issued, before further action or even prosecution is considered, by which point it is out of the school's hands. Thank you for your understanding in this matter. Ultimately, the positive behind all this is that children in school 100% of the time = a better, fuller education.

## **Morning Snack Reminder**

All children are only allowed to eat FRUIT/VEG/DRIED FRUIT only at breaktimes. No cereal bars or other snacks are allowed.

Jewellery: very small, plain stud earrings are permitted but larger studs and hoops/dangly earrings are not permitted. All jewellery to be removed for PE. If children are too young or unable to take out own earrings, they should not wear them on PE/swim days.

Hair: hair must be tied back for the whole school day. We will ask children to tie their hair back when they come in with it loose.

## MCAS APP

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Please use the MCAS (My Child at School) app to pay for school dinners, Breakfast Club, Thursday Lego and Fun Club, school trips/experiences. You also need it to book parent evening appointments and One Plan meetings.

### Breakfast Club and After School Clubs

To attend Breakfast Club, just turn up at the black door in the carpark and ring the doorbell. There is a sibling discount which will show up on your MCAS account. Option 1: Breakfast Club starts at 8am and includes Toast/cereal/drinks for £3.50 per day. Option 2: 'Early Bird' Club starts at 8.15am and does not include food or drink - we expect that children have eaten before they arrive. The cost for Early Bird Club is only £1.25 per day. If a child needs to arrive before 8.15am, the price will be  $\pounds$ 3.50, regardless of whether they eat or not.

All our after-school clubs run 3.15-4.15pm and must be booked in advance. All Clubs are available to all ages. See details for each club below:
