## **Sun Protection**

We are glad the sun has finally made an appearance! On sunny days, please apply sunscreen before school and supply a sun hat. Staff cannot apply suncream to children, so it is easiest if it is done before school.

### **SATs**

The Year 6 pupils have now completed their SATs and we are incredibly proud of them. They conducted themselves calmly and maturely, even when a few of the tests were particularly challenging. You may have seen in the national news headlines that many teachers and parents were outraged at how challenging the reading paper was! We agree, but hopefully the average pass mark will reflect this and the children who have an 'age related' level of reading will pass. Whatever the result, we are impressed with our pupils and the staff who teach and support Year 6 have done an incredible job in preparing them for their first set of 'proper' exams. We have really tried to reiterate to the children that they are not just a number or a piece of data – this preparation has helped them to be ready for Secondary education and to feel confident in Maths and English. Well done to all involved. The papers are sent off to be externally marked and we will know the results in July.

Year 2 pupils also have to complete SATs papers before the end of May, but these are much more low key and are not conducted in an exam-style environment. From the child's point of view, they are just completing another piece of work. The Year 2 SATs are not externally marked either; they are used to inform teacher judgement and the results are considered along with all the work that children complete in lessons to get an overall judgement. Most importantly, the information is used by teachers to highlight any gaps in learning that need to be plugged.

Both Y2 and Y6 will have an extra sheet of paper with their annual school report (coming to parents in July) which will say whether an age-related expectation has been met.

### Communication at drop off time

Parents are not allowed on site in the mornings - this is a safeguarding matter. If you need to communicate with the class teacher you have several options: leave a message with Mrs Coombs at the office; send an email directly to the teacher; write a note in the reading diary and ask your child to show us; write a handwritten letter and put in an envelope marked with the teacher's

name. Each teacher is on the gate once per week, so quick messages can also be passed this way. If you need a face-to-face meeting with a teacher, I encourage you to book an appointment via email or have a word at the end of the day if it is brief.

### **Tennis**

Stebbing Tennis Club have been coming in to coach each class during the summer term. They are doing this for free and hope to get as many children interested in Tennis as possible.

### **Music Event**

On the 7th July, you will hopefully be able to watch a streamed concert of each school in our Trust performing a song or two. The theme this year is 'Celebrate'. More details of how to access the concert will be given soon. All songs are pre-recorded so families should be able to watch at home if they wish. We will be recording Shalford's contribution soon and I can assure you that it is only streamed to Compass families and not shared anywhere else. We trust that you will not attempt to record the event or share it on Social Media. ## **Staffing Update**

After sorting through a lot of application forms and a tough round of interviews, we have appointed a very experienced teacher - Mrs Kate Barford - to join the team from September. I know you will all give her a warm welcome.

You will receive a letter in July, stating your child's class teacher for 2023-24.

## School Day/Attendance Reminder

Thank you to those parents who are getting their children to school on time every day and to those who are making an effort to improve punctuality - we have noticed and appreciate you working hard on this so that children can benefit from a full school day and do not miss out on any essential part of it.

Drop off time is between 8.35am and 8.45am. If children miss the register at 8.45am, they will be marked as unauthorised/late. Pick up time is 3.15pm outside your child's classroom. The new attendance officer now comes to school regularly and grills me about the attendance of anyone who has dropped below 95%, so be prepared for a phone call or a meeting with her, if this applies to your child. Do speak to one of us if you are having an issue getting your child to school on time.

I cannot authorise term time holidays or fun days out during term time, so do expect a fine if you take your child out. All schools across Essex follow the same expectations. For your information, revenue from fines does not come to us, but to the Local Authority. Only two fines per year will be issued, before further action or even prosecution is considered, by which point it is out of the school's hands. Thank you for your understanding in this matter. The positive message here is that children in school 100% of the time = a better, fuller education.

## Transition to Secondary – Please read if you have a child in Y5 or Y6

Y6 families will hopefully know what the dates for transition are by now, but if you don't, please contact the Secondary school directly. They are not great at communicating with small village schools! If your child is missing school to attend a transition event, please email Mrs Coombs so that she can put the correct code in the register.

Y5 parents - it may seem too soon to think about it, but it is time to start thinking about which Secondary School is best for your child and hopefully attend some open days. Look on the individual school websites for open days or give them a ring. The nearest schools are Tabor and Hedingham but we find that children from Shalford go to a range of other schools too. Open days will be in September and the deadline to apply for a Secondary place is yet to be announced, but is usually in October each year. It can be overwhelming if it is your first child and it feels like the schedule is tight to make a quick decision.

# **Morning Snack Reminder**

All children are only allowed to eat FRUIT/VEG/DRIED FRUIT only at breaktimes. No cereal bars or other snacks are allowed.

#### Uniform and PE Kit Reminders

Children can now wear the summer uniform if they wish - yellow gingham items. Black or grey shorts. Footwear remains the same - no sandals please just ordinary school shoes. Many Thanks.

### **MCAS APP**



Please use the MCAS (My Child at School) app to pay for school dinners, Breakfast Club, Thursday Lego and Fun Club, school trips/experiences. You also need it to book parent

evening appointments and One Plan meetings.

### Breakfast Club and After School Clubs

To attend Breakfast Club, just turn up at the black door in the carpark and ring the doorbell. There is a sibling discount which will show up on your MCAS account. Option 1: Breakfast Club starts at 8am and includes Toast/cereal/drinks for £3.50 per day. Option 2: 'Early Bird' Club starts at 8.15am and does not include food or drink - we expect that children have eaten before they arrive. The cost for Early Bird Club is only £1.25 per day. If a child needs to arrive before 8.15am, the price will be £3.50, regardless of whether they eat or not.

All our after-school clubs run 3.15-4.15pm and must be booked in advance. All Clubs are available to all ages. See details for each club below:
